Dear Parents/ Carers.

In today's assembly, we reflected on the season of Lent, which began on Wednesday with the celebration of Ash Wednesday. We took time to remind ourselves of the importance of Lent and listened to the parable of The Lost Sheep. I reminded the children that just as the shepherd seeks out the lost sheep, God will always be there to guide us, never allowing us to be lost.

During this season of Lent, we focus on growing closer to God through our prayers and actions. We are preparing ourselves to celebrate the joyous news of Jesus' resurrection on Easter Sunday.

Lenten Cross:

As the children continue their journey of faith, during Lent each class will be sending home a 'Lenten Cross' prayer bag containing a holding cross, a battery tea light and a special prayer to share together as a family during this important part of the liturgical year.

Each class has one prayer bag and therefore we ask that it is returned to school the next day to ensure that as many families as possible have the opportunity to share in this experience during Lent.

The response from families who took home the 'Travelling Rosary' and 'Travelling Crib' was very positive; it was a lovely opportunity for the children to share with you how we pray in school. I am sure that those families who now receive the 'Lenten Cross' will experience a similar time of prayer and reflection this Lent.

Year 2 In School Retreat:

On Monday Year 2 had a special retreat day with Anne and Sister Anne. In the morning we thought about Catholic Social Teaching and the importance of human dignity (everyone is special), stewardship (caring for God's world), promoting peace and solidarity (showing we care). In the afternoon we prepared and led a special prayer and assembly.

On Tuesday, Reception had a very special visit from the Wonder Dome. They became astronauts and travelled to space on a rocket. They walked on the moon and found out lots of facts about the planets in our solar system. We really enjoyed watching a real life astronaut clean his teeth in space.
