
At Cheadle Catholic Infant School we love and respect each other. We **love** to learn and let our inner light **shine** brightly in all that we do.


#### Dear Parents/ Carers,

#### Questionnaire:

Thank you to everyone who took the time to respond to our parent questionnaire. Your feedback is valuable to us and helps the school understand what matters most to you. It also supports our ongoing efforts to improve the school for the benefit of your children.

We have compiled the results and will be discussing them at the next governor's meeting and sharing them with staff. This will help us continue to make our school a better place for both pupils and parents. Please see the results and some comments below.

## Question 1: My child enjoys school

96% of parents agreed or strongly agreed.

We are delighted that your children enjoy coming to school. This is evident in their enthusiasm for learning every day.

# Question 2: I am happy with the Catholic teaching, values & attitudes that the school teaches 96% of parents agreed or strongly agreed.

We take great pride in our core values, mission, and ethos. We are proud of the significant progress our children make in their faith journey every day.

### Question 3: The school is a supportive and joyful community

96% of parents agreed or strongly agreed.

We are proud of the warm, welcoming environment we have created here, where our school community supports one another and fosters a sense of joy in learning.

## Question 4: Staff at this school are positive role models for my child

99% of parents agreed or strongly agreed.

We are delighted that our staff are seen as positive role models and we remain committed to ensuring that we continue to lead by example in all that we do.

#### Question 5: The school works well with the local parishes

87% of parents agreed or strongly agreed.

We value the strong relationship we have with our local parishes and appreciate the role they play in supporting our school and the faith development of our children.

## Question 6: I understand the school's Catholic mission and I am supportive of it

94% of parents agreed or strongly agreed.

We are grateful for your continued support as we work together to nurture the faith of our children.

## Question 7: The school supports my child's spiritual and moral development

96% of parents agreed or strongly agreed.

It is a priority for us to help children develop strong values and a deep sense of faith.

#### Question 8: I am invited to be involved in the prayer life of the school

88% of parents agreed or strongly agreed.

We will continue to offer opportunities for you to be involved in this important aspect of our school life.

#### Question 9: The school makes sure that the children are well behaved

94% of parents agreed or strongly agreed.

We take great pride in fostering an environment where good behaviour is encouraged and celebrated. Our staff work hard to ensure that all children are guided in positive behaviour and supported in making good choices.

#### Question 10: My child feels safe & secure in school.

100% of parents agreed or strongly agreed

Safeguarding and e-safety are taught daily. Our Bully Busters and Playground Friends help children feel secure. We encourage children to always seek help if they need it.

Question 11: My child has been bullied, and the school dealt with the bullying quickly and effectively 8% of parents agreed or strongly agreed. 92% of parents said their child had not been bullied.

We are pleased that the majority of parents reported that their children have not experienced bullying. For the 8% who agreed or strongly agreed, we take these concerns seriously and continue to work closely with children and families to ensure any issues are dealt with quickly and effectively.

# Question 12: When I have raised concerns with the school, they have been dealt with properly 84% of parents agreed or strongly agreed.

We strive to address all concerns raised by parents promptly and effectively. We are committed to improving our communication and responsiveness to ensure that every concern is handled appropriately.

## Question 13: The school has high expectations for my child

92% of parents agreed or strongly agreed.

We will continue to challenge all children to reach their full potential academically, spiritually, and personally.

## Question 14: School involves parents/carers in their child's learning

96% of parents agreed or strongly agreed.

We are pleased to know that many of you feel involved in your child's learning. We will continue to maintain strong communication and offering various opportunities for parents to engage in their child's educational journey.

98% of parents agreed or strongly agreed.

Our staff work hard to ensure every child reaches their full potential and we continue to celebrate their successes.

96% of parents agreed or strongly agreed.

We are proud of the diverse and engaging curriculum we offer. We remain focused on providing a well-rounded education that sparks curiosity and fosters a love of learning.

Our aim is to provide clear and accessible resources and information about what your child is learning, and we will continue to update the site regularly.

# Question 18: My child has SEND and the school gives my child the support they need to succeed 100% of parents agreed or strongly agreed.

We are committed to providing a nurturing and supportive environment for all children, ensuring their individual needs are met.

#### Question 19: I would recommend this school to another parent

100% of parents agreed or strongly agreed.

We are thrilled to hear that every parent would recommend our school. This is a wonderful affirmation of the work we do and the positive environment we strive to create for our students and their families.

## Here are some of the positive comments that we received:

CCIS is a lovely school, the staff foster a positive attitude in the school and as a parent I have always felt listened to whenever raising any issues. The attitude towards learning is positive and the children arrive ready in juniors. I feel that the Catholic values are respected.

I am delighted with how quickly xx has settled into school. He genuinely looks forward to going into to school every day. We are extremely happy with the positive feedback we've received and the constructive comments shared. Below are some of the key points you raised, along with our responses.

#### **Your Comments:**

## 1. Exposure to Screens:

o "It would be wonderful if exposure to screens could be reduced."

## 2. Inclusion of Second Carers:

"It would be nice to include second carers in the communications, please."

## 3. Overwhelming Amount of Messages:

 "School could perhaps look at the number of messages being sent to parents about various activities. It can feel overwhelming, especially if doubling up with Junior School."

#### 4. Too Many Systems:

o "There are too many systems (School Grid, Magic Booking, Parent Pay, etc.)."

## 5. Delayed Payments and Reconciliation:

 "Payments take time to be reconciled, so I receive messages about late payments and overdue fees."

## 6. Homework Expectations:

 "Sometimes we are unsure about the expectations for homework, and it's not communicated properly."

## 7. Parent Engagement Opportunities:

 "Although it's fantastic to invite parents to PE, maths workshops, thumbs up days, etc., what about all the children whose parents can't attend due to work commitments?"

## 8. School Dinners for Nursery:

o "What about offering school dinners for Nursery children

## Our Response:

## 1. Reducing Screen Time:

 As a staff, we will make a conscious effort to reduce interactive whiteboard screen time, especially during wet playtimes or lunchtimes. Please be reassured that we never allow children to watch anything inappropriate.

#### 2. Inclusion of All Carers:

- Emails are sent to priority 1 and priority 2 parents/carers, text messages will now go parents/ carers who have the app. Please check your emails, you will have received a reminder email today from School Gateway about how to download the app.
- We will ensure that most of the necessary information is included in our weekly newsletter, please ensure you read it every Friday for updates.

## 3. Reducing Message Overload:

 We understand that receiving multiple messages can feel overwhelming. Moving forward, we will aim to streamline our communications, making sure we consolidate important details into the weekly newsletter.

## 4. Consolidating Systems:

- While Magic Booking and Parent Pay are efficient for booking wraparound care, school trips, and payments, we acknowledge the confusion caused by multiple systems. Unfortunately there is not one system that will cater for all school payments.
- We are not yet using School Grid for lunch bookings but this will be in place after the Easter holidays (further details to follow)
- Please note that payments made via government or work vouchers take longer to reconcile and there is unfortunately no way to speed up that process.

## 5. Clarifying Homework Expectations:

 Year group leaders will be sending out clear information about spellings and homework expectations early next week. You will also have the opportunity to discuss any concerns with your child's class teacher during Parent's Evening.

## 6. Parent Engagement:

 We will continue offering parents opportunities to visit and engage in various school events but we will ensure some of these events are scheduled towards the end of the day to better accommodate working parents.

## 7. Nursery School Dinners:

 We are excited to offer Nursery children the opportunity to purchase a hot school dinner after the Easter holidays

We value your feedback and will continue to listen and adapt to better meet the needs of our community. If you have any further questions or concerns, please don't hesitate to contact the school office, your child's class teacher, or myself directly.
