Little Way Week:

This week we have also been thinking about 'Little Way Week' in school. St Thérèse was a little girl who lived in France. She tried to make good choices - she was kind to her sisters and worked hard at school, but sometimes she found that being good could be difficult. Thérèse made up her mind to try to do a good deed every day. She realised that just because she was little, it didn't mean that her little actions couldn't make a big difference. This was called her 'little way' and this little girl grew up to be Saint Thérèse.

Prayer & Liturgy at Cheadle Catholic Infant School

Opportunities for prayer at Cheadle Catholic Infant School are planned to be varied and reflect our Catholic tradition.

We make sure the children have plenty of opportunities to take ownership of their own worship and encourage them on their own personal spiritual journey. All aspects of Prayer and Liturgy are embedded into school life from whole school celebration to individual prayer and reflection.

Prayer in class

Our class daily prayers include a prayer at the beginning and end of the school day, grace before meals and a thankyou prayer after meals. We give the children the chance to plan for Prayer and Liturgy themselves on a regular basis by choosing and writing prayers.

Assemblies

Mrs Glynn leads whole school assemblies on Mondays and Fridays. Monday is a celebration of Sunday's Gospel. We come together as a whole school to share the Sunday Gospel. We reflect on the scripture and consider how we can apply this to our lives in the coming week.

Friday is a celebration assembly when we congratulate the children who have been identified as Stars of the Week, Spellers of the Week and have a birthday during the week. We also talk about other faiths and celebrations that may be occurring at this time.

Travelling Rosary, Crib & Cross:

During October (the month of the Holy Rosary), May (Month of Mary), Advent and Lent each class teacher will send home a prayer bag containing 'The Travelling Rosary', 'Travelling Cross,' or 'Travelling Crib' with a different child each day.

Using our travelling prayer bags families are given the opportunity to reflect and pray together at home.

Nursery have been studying Mo Farah and all his achievements, we have had a circle time to celebrate our strengths and our differences.


Reception:

Reception will learn all about Mae Jemison, who was the first black woman to travel into space. We will listen to the story 'Mae amongst the stars' and discuss how Mae dreamt of being an astronaut when she was a little girl. We will draw pictures of what we would like to be when we grow up

Year 1 have been learning about Mary Seacole.

We learnt that she was born in Jamaica and had a Scottish father and Jamaican mother. Her mother taught her how to use plants to help sick people.

She paid for herself to travel to the Crimean war to help the soldiers.





Show Racism The Red Card

On Friday 18th October we will be asking the children to wear something red to school (headband, socks, badge, bow) in order to support 'Show Racism the Red Card.' We will be discussing how everyone should be treated with respect, dignity and kindness regardless of colour, race, religion or gender. We will be discussing what is meant by the word 'racism' and what we can do to ensure that we and others know that it is unacceptable. We want our children to understand that racism is not something that should be ignored and that if we all stand up to racism we can make a difference.

If you or any other member of your family are unable to attend, your child will complete the activities with their class teacher or teaching assistant.
