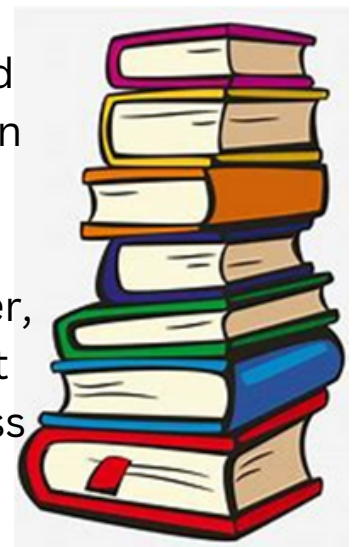
Booknic
